Expanding access in Southwest & Central Virginia

Brightspeed is rapidly transforming the digital landscape in Virginia where four in ten residents are unable to purchase a fiber internet plan.* Once fully deployed, the company's multi-gigabit fiber network will serve 65,500 locations across Buena Vista, Campbell, Carroll, Franklin, Galax, Halifax, Henry, Lexington, Martinsville, Rockbridge and Wythe counties.

"In Rockbridge County, families and businesses have waited far too long for the kind of reliable, high-speed internet that others take for granted," said Rockbridge County Board of Supervisors Chair Leslie Ayers. "Fiber connectivity changes everything; it means students can learn without interruption, small businesses can compete online, and residents can access healthcare and jobs no matter where they live. Bringing fiber to our communities isn't just about faster speeds; it's about creating opportunity and ensuring every community has a fair shot at success in today's digital world."

"Reliable, high-speed internet is essential for the future," said Lexington City Mayor Frank Friedman. "From supporting our small businesses and local schools, and to keeping residents connected with opportunities across the country, fiber connectivity will make a significant difference in lives of our citizens. Funding sparks expansion

The company <u>recently announced</u> that it has secured more than \$16.6 million in federal Broadband Equity Access and Deployment (BEAD) program funding** to augment its private investment in building its fiber network in Viginia to reach another 4,963 locations in the state. Approximately \$970,000 of that funding together with Brightspeed's investment of nearly \$2.5 million will directly impact Galax, Henry and Martinsville counties by expanding the company's fiber build to reach nearly 400 additional locations in those counties.

Additionally, Virginia awarded Brightspeed more than \$2.7 million in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds to give nearly 1,000 more Virginians access to high-speed connectivity they don't have today.

Once complete, Brightspeed Fiber Internet will reach more than 177,000 homes and businesses across the state, transforming the digital landscape for Virginia communities.
